Is it a fiddle or a violin? The Inland Oceans Arts Alliance is proud to present the group known as *Bowties* who say both! Known for their unique blend of classical and folk music, *Bowties* use a guitar, piano, fiddle, and violin to present the best of both types of music.

Gordon Stobbe and Greg Simm, from Halifax, will please you with their folk and down-east music, and Nancy Dahn and Timothy Steeves will thrill you with music ranging from Bach to Benoit. *Bowties* have travelled throughout Canada and around the world delighting audiences with their widely acclaimed performances.

Nancy and Timothy have performed together as "Duo Concertante" for over ten years. They have toured through Europe, Russia, and in the U.S.A. to acclaim, most notably at its debut at Wigmore Hall (London, U.K.). Not only do they play the classics, including Mozart, but they also champion Canadian composers like R. Murray Schafer and their commission of his "Duo for Violin and Piano" at Ottawa's International Chamber Music Festival.

Gordon is a Master Fiddler who performs, composes, arranges, and publishes traditional North American fiddle music, but does not limit himself to the fiddle. He also plays the mandolin, guitar, and claw hammer banjo. Many of Gordon's instruction books are standard issue for fiddle teachers throughout North America.

Greg plays acoustic and electric bass and guitar. His musical styles range from country to traditional folk. Greg is at home as a composer and producer, but he also performs with Natalie MacMaster, Laura Smith, Lenny Gallant, and Richard Wood. Both Greg and Gordon will have your toes tapping to Canada's rich Maritime music and well known folk songs.

Come out to the Eriksdale Recreation Centre on April 17, 2011. **Opening for Bowties will be Kolton McIntosh of Eriksdale** at 7:30 p.m. At 8:00 p.m. enjoy *Bowties*.
